Key Ideas

- Animals are living things and need food to survive.
- There are many different groups of animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They have different structures, and they eat different types of foods.
- Animals can be carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.
- Food provides energy and supports growth.

Amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.    frog toad newt
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.    chicken flamingo robin
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.    goldfish tuna shark
Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air and grow hair or fur. They give birth to live young and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.     humans mouse dog cow
Reptiles	Reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin and lay eggs.    snake tortoise lizard

What do animals eat?

Carnivore
Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat).

Herbivore
Animals that only eat plants.

Omnivore
Animals that eat both meat and plants.
