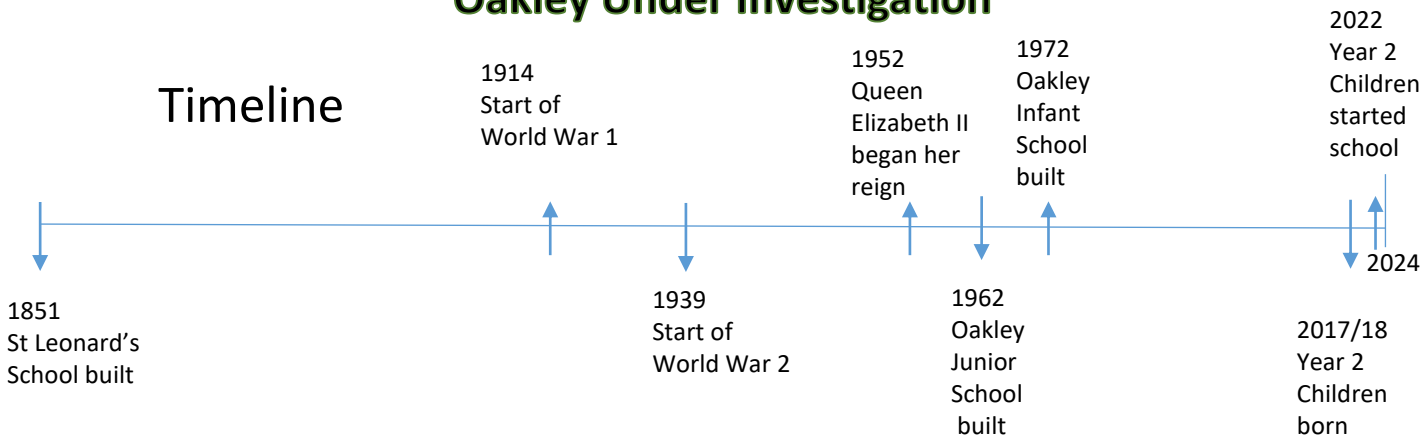
Word	Definition
Key	Explains the meanings of symbols.
Symbol	A mark or picture that shows what something is on a map.
Compass	An instrument to show the directions north, south, east and west.
County	An area of a country.
Country	A country is a land controlled by a single government.
Continent	A large continuous piece of land, often involving lots of countries. There are seven continents of the world.
Route	A way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination.
Human Feature	Human features are things made or built by humans like cities, houses, roads, bridges, ports, farms and factories.
Physical Features	Physical features can be things such as mountains, rivers, forests, and fields. It can also be used to refer to living things.

Victorian	Victorian era, the period between about 1820 and 1914, corresponding roughly to the period of Queen Victoria's reign.

Investigating Oakley

Key knowledge about plants:

Plants grow from seeds and bulbs

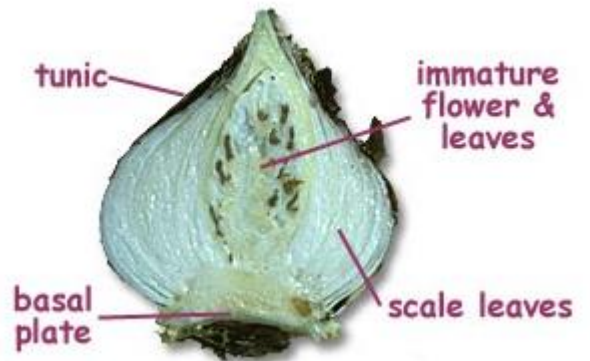
Seeds remain dormant until given water, light and food.

Bulbs remain underground all year – they contain a whole plant inside them.

The bulb protects & feeds the plant during the winter.

Plants need light, water and warmth to grow and survive.

Word	Definition
Seed	The small, hard part of a plant from which a new plant grows.
Bulb	A bulb is a root- shaped like an onion that is part of some plants. It stores food while the plant is resting from growing in the winter.
Roots	The part of a plant that grows downwards, holds the plant in place and takes in water from the soil.
Shoots	A plant that comes up above the ground when it is beginning to grow.
Germination	The growth of a seed into a young plant or seedling.
Leaves	Usually, the flat green parts of a plant that grow from the plant's stem.
