- There are five oceans – the Pacific (the largest), Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic.
- The Equator goes around the centre of the earth, the North Pole (Arctic) is at the very top and the South Pole (Antarctica) is at the very bottom of the Earth.
- We live in the United Kingdom which is in the continent of Europe.
- Austria is also a country in Europe, but it has some different physical and human features to England.
- Sydney is the name of a city in Australia. Australia is the name of both the country and the continent.
- The Amazon rainforest is in Brazil, on the continent of South America.
- Egypt is a country in the continent of Africa. There are pyramids and the River Nile here.

Location	A specific place.

Key knowledge about plants:

Plants grow from seeds/bulbs.

A seed contains a miniature plant that can develop into a fully grown plant.

A bulb has underground vertical shoots which already have modified leaves.

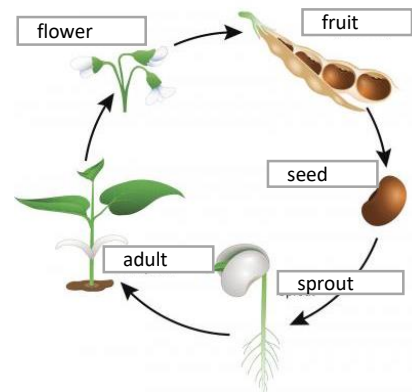
Seeds and bulbs need water to grow but most do not need light (germination).

Seeds and bulbs have food stores inside them to help the plant start to grow.

A plant's growth is affected by the amount of light, water and warmth.



Life cycle of a plant

Word	Definition
seed	The small, hard part of a plant from which a new plant grows.
bulb	A root shaped like an onion that grows into a flower or plant.
leaves	Usually, flat green parts that grow from a plant stem.
germination	The growth of a seed into a young plant or seedling.
roots	The part of a plant that grows downward, holds the plant in place and takes in water from the soil.
