- provide a broad balanced curriculum;
- ensure that all children have equal access to the curriculum regardless of race, gender or ethnicity; encourage children to do their best;
- encourage children to take care of their surroundings;
- inform parents of their children's progress at termly open evenings and through an annual report;
- inform parents of school activities through regular newsletters;
- offer parents opportunities to be involved in school life;
- inform parents of any significant concerns or problems affecting their child's work or behaviour.

- make sure that the child attends regularly and provide a prompt explanation if the child is absent;
- ensure the child is picked up promptly at 3.15pm;
- attend open afternoons/evenings to discuss the child's progress;
- try to attend celebration assembly when the child is involved;
- support the school's homework policy;
- inform the school of any significant concerns or problems that may affect the child's work or behaviour.
