Resources on this page:

- A common exception list colouring sheet. Activities like these can help your child to learn the words.
- A list of common exception words. These are the words that need to be learnt as they are not easily phonetically decodable. By the end of the year we would hope that your child could read and write most of them.
- A phase 3 and 5 sound mat. This can be used to support reading and writing at home. The pictures can help to jog their memory.
- A number square. Please use this to support your child to count, to notice patterns, to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and to talk about the tens and ones in each number.
- Please support your child to tell the time. In Year 2, we will support them to practise o'clock, half past, quarter to and past and finally increments of 5 minutes. This is a helpful website to support you. There is also a paper clock that you can cut out and make. <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/time/teaching-clock>
- Handwriting progression – this document shows the order in which we teach handwriting. You may want to do some of the warm up exercises at home or look at some of the joins when your child is ready.
- Place value models – have a look at the way that we represent place value (tens and ones) in class. It may help your child to practise this at home. Without a secure understanding of place value, they will find it very difficult to move onto more difficult maths e.g. adding two digit numbers.
