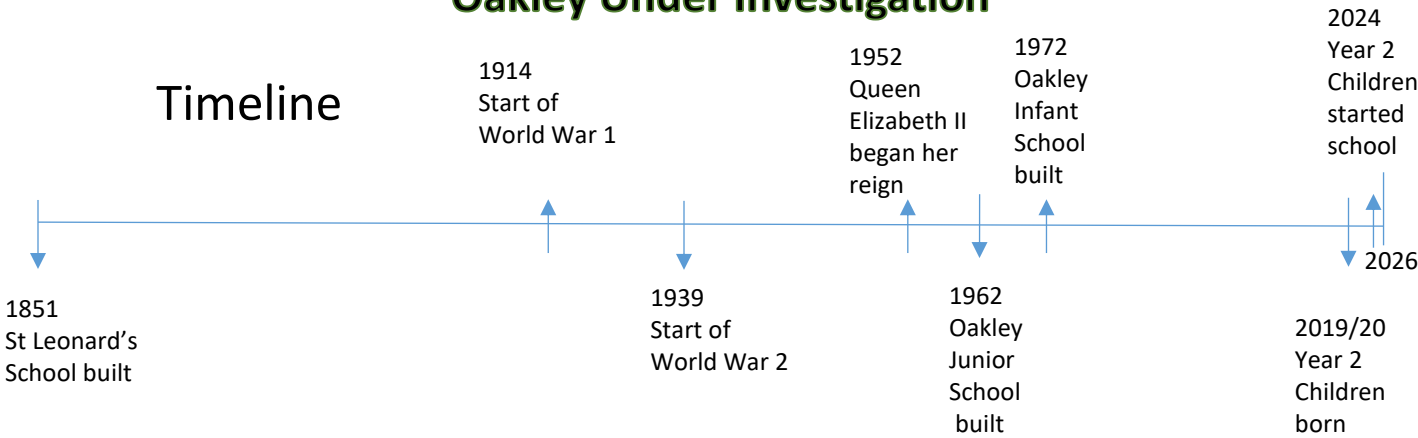

### Key knowledge about plants:

*Plants grow from seeds and bulbs*

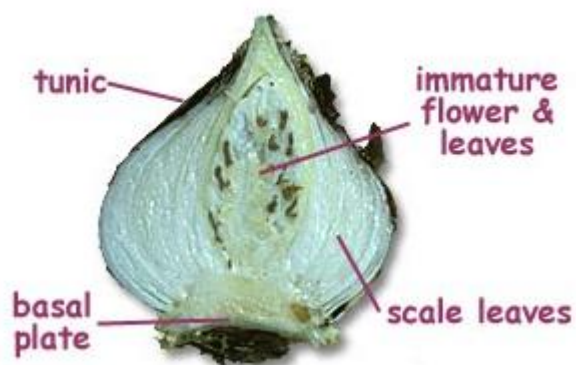
*Seeds remain dormant until given water, light and food.*

*Bulbs remain underground all year – they contain a whole plant inside them.*

*The bulb protects & feeds the plant during the winter.*

*Plants need light, water and warmth to grow and survive.*

| Bulb        | A <b>bulb</b> is a root- shaped like an onion that is part of some plants. It stores food while the plant is resting from growing in the winter. |
| Roots       | The part of a plant that grows downwards, holds the plant in place and takes in water from the soil.                                             |
| Shoots      | A plant that comes up above the ground when it is beginning to grow.                                                                             |
| Germination | The growth of a seed into a young plant or seedling.                                                                                             |
| Leaves      | Usually, the flat green parts of a plant that grow from the plant's stem.                                                                        |
